Medical Team sees Hundreds of Haitians

Special Thank you to Allecia Correll for providing the following article Our team of 20 went to serve Haitian Christian Ministries by providing a medical clinic June 2nd - 10th. Since we were such a large team, we split in half Monday and



Tuesday between Pillatre and Lory serving just over 400 patients. Pillatre has a clinic building which includes 3 exam rooms and a pharmacy. It also has a Haitian doctor. nurse, and pharmacist on staff, so we were there to restock the pharmacy, see additional patients, and work beside our Haitian staff. Lory doesn't have a medical clinic yet, so

we set up shop inside the church with the "pharmacy" on the stage behind the podium. There is already plans to place a clinic at this location and we look forward to the day when we get to serve in that new building.

On Wednesday, our entire team visited the new church plant in Haut Dehaine. We were the first medical team to visit that location and saw 200 patients at the base of a mountain, with no building or bathrooms. What an amazing opportunity to be able to serve the unreached, both medically and spiritually. Our team looks forward to other teams vising this community and other outlving communities in the future.

We had an amazing opportunity to join the team traveling with us on a Welcome Home Haiti house dedication Thursday morning. It was such an amazing site to see the family walk into their new home and see beds with new sheets and pillows surrounded

This goat will provide milk for their family, as well as milk to sell to others, and has the ability to provide other goats for sale. The worship and prayer service was really special and their surrounding neighbors were all there to help them celebrate! We went to the clinic that afternoon and saw the remainder of patients for the week. We saw just over 700 patients in 3 1/2 days. God is good!

HCM Board Changes

Over the past few months, several changes have occurred related to the HCM board. We have highlighted one very important change in that we welcomed Pastor Bob to the board. One other change recently made was to see Tyler Hari step down from the board and have Tommy Nika, Global Outreach Pastor at Eastview Christian Church, take his place. We asked Tyler a few questions to reflect back upon his time serving HCM.

How long have you been involved in HCM?

My first experience with HCM was when my dad and I went on a summer mission trip in 1999. We returned as a family in 2001 and then again in the spring of 2003. God continued to cultivate a desire in our hearts to get more involved with the ministry so we continued to engage with the ministry and people of HCM more and more.

How have you seen God grow the ministry?

Over the past 18 years it's been incredible to see God grow the ministry of HCM. Some of the larger ministry growth areas that we have gotten to celebrate include the Pillatre campus buildout, the completion of the new church building, the explosive growth of the school and medical clinic as well as the growth at the Lory church. The most energizing piece of the ministry today is the renewed focus and vision on church planting. The leadership of HCM is focused on church planting like never before. We've already seen the fruit of a 3rd church plant that was birthed out of our current HCM churches combined outreach initiatives.

What is one thing/memory that sticks out from either serving on the board or a trip to Haiti?

There are too many to list! It would be hard to narrow down. HCM and the country of Haiti have had such a profound impact on my family's lives. I think the lesson God has been teaching me over the past 18 months related to HCM is the assurance that this is God's ministry. Ultimately he is in control and is all-powerful, all-knowing and ever-present. I've seen numerous examples of God's protection, provision and planning for the ministry that superseded any of our foresight or planning. It's great to be reminded that while he chooses to work in and through us, ultimately he will protect his bride and usher her forward into new ministry and influence in the communities of Haiti and all over northern Haiti.

How can we be praying for you and your family?

I would simply ask that you pray for my parents (Steve and Shelley Hari) along with my sisters (Jadyn, Jasmine, Janae) who recently moved to Haiti full-time effective June 1, 2017. They founded Welcome Home Haiti in 2010 and felt God's calling to re-locate to Haiti as their ministry has grown beyond what any of us ever expected. They have given so sacrificially over the past 7 years as they worked full-time and started Welcome Home Haiti on the side. They spent countless hours on the weekends speaking with groups, raising funds, traveling, sharing their vision and giving of their own finances... now they've moved to Haiti. We couldn't be more proud of them, but we miss them. Pray for the ministry of HCM and WHH to grow. Pray for the safety of my parents and sisters. Pray that more lives would be changed for eternity because of these ministries.
