Special Thank you to Desiree Campbell for providing the following article On July 6th, our team of 15 Christians from Eastview Christian Church left Bloomington-Normal to make our way to Cap Haitian, Haiti. God assembled such a strong team with a unique and diverse set of skills, allowing us to hit the ground running to share his glory. On Saturday, we started our journey by unpacking two crates we had sent down in early May. These crates were filled with painting supplies, teacher's clinic items, and a blessing of over 600 sports balls. Later that day, we had some time to work on campus at Pillatre. We focused on lawn care, organizing the 18 bags of inventory we brought down, and preparing the buildings that would be painted. It was exciting to take a tour with the Hari family to the see the location of where the beautiful new field house is being built. In addition to seeing location of the field house, we also saw where, and how, each individual brick for the Welcome Home Haiti houses are manufactured.













Sunday was such glorious day! We not only had the honor to worship with our Haitian brothers and sisters at the church in Pillatre. but we were able to celebrate the addition of two new Pastors. Following that experience, we changed locations and worshiped with a different group in Haut-Dehaine.

We continued to be blessed to work with Pastor Bob, Pastor Jacques (from Lory), and Pastor Phito (from Haut-Dehaine) all week. Together with the support of many Haitian brothers and sisters we were extremely excited to host not only one, but two VBS camps in both at Lory and Haut-Dehaine. We teamed up with our interpreters for a live reenactment of the Good Samaritan. Smiles, laughter, and joy filled each church with so much love for God!

We enjoyed the remainder of our time soaking up what God had planned for us. We walked through the community as disciples, giving each of us the opportunity to pour ridiculous amounts of love to all of God's people and seeing His work unfold before our very eyes.

It truly amazes me how God brought together a team of 15 people, who for the most part were perfect strangers, and used them in mighty ways to fulfill His will and purpose. Everyone's unique talents and gifts were utilized in the best way to form a collaborative unit as we served others. Some were the mouthpiece, some were the "get'er done guys", and some were the funny bone, but we all were God's hands and feet. With this being my first trip, I was completely in "awe" with how much of a



true partnership we have with Haitian Christian Ministries and the incredible work Welcome Home Haiti is doing!
